ENGAGED LEARNING

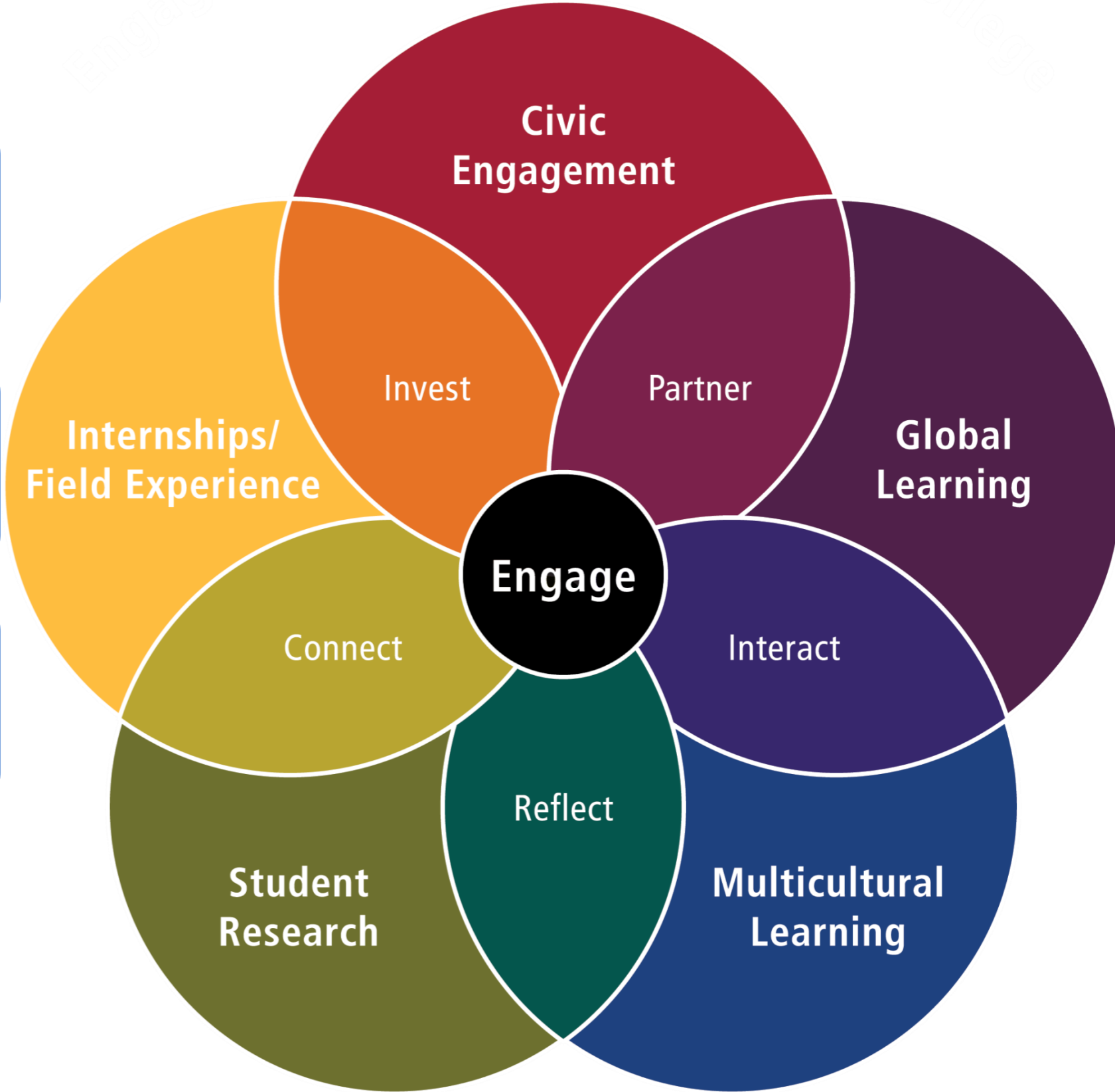

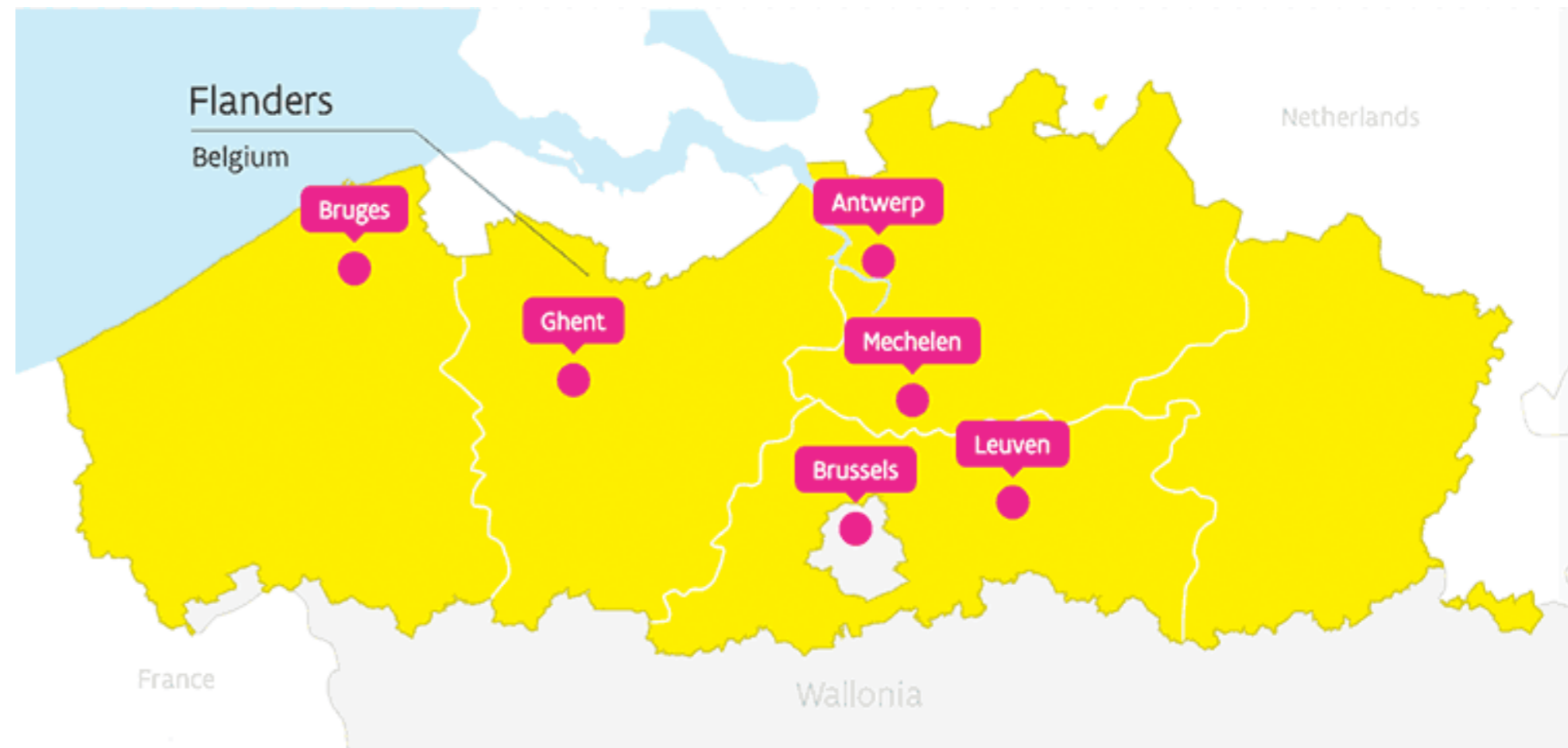
